INVOCATION

M: In the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

CONFESSION

M: Dear friends, let us approach God with a true heart and confess our sins, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to forgive us.

C: Lord of life, I confess that I am by nature dead in sin.
For faithless worrying and selfish pride,
For sins of habit and sins of choice,
For the evil I have done and the good I have failed to do,
You should cast me away from your presence forever.
O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Forgive me, for Jesus' sake.

ABSOLUTION

M: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. In his great mercy, God made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in our sins. Hear the word of Christ through his called servant:

I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.



St. Mary, Mother of Our Lord

Lutheran worship is liturgical. While that often refers to an order of worship, it can also refer to the calendar of the Church Year. The Church Year includes major festivals, such as Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, Pentecost, etc... Today we recognize a minor festival, the Festival of St. Mary, Mother of Our Lord.

Just as we do not worship any of the saints or any person, so we do not worship Mary. However, we concur with Mary when she sang, "From this day all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me..." (Luke 1:48,49) Mary was the servant whom the Lord chose through whom he would bring the Savior into the world. Mary is rightfully called the "mother of God" since firstborn son is true God. Even though God chose Mary for this unique role in salvation history, she herself recognized her need for the Savior whom she bore, singing, "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior..." (Luke 1:46,47)

Worship Tidbit for the 12th Sunday after Pentecost

After we hear God's word in the sermon, God's people naturally respond. Sometimes that is with a confession of faith (one of the Creeds). Other times it is with a song of praise. In the Common Service, we sing, "Create in me a clean heart, O God." While the sermon has already proclaimed that God has purified our hearts through the blood of Christ, we pray in this song that the Lord would cause his word to take root in our hearts and lives. Another response to the sermon we may sing is the *Te Deum Laudamus* (Latin for "We praise you, O God"). Martin Luther considered this ancient canticle (5th century) another creed.

GOOD SHEPHERD 40TH ANNIVERSARY BOOK

A pictorial retrospective of Good Shepherd has been produced and is at church. You are welcome to look through it. While there are many photos, there is also a lot of information about the history of the congregation. So, if you look at it, you will probably not be able to read through all the articles. The copy at church will be placed in Good Shepherd's library, but you may want your own copy. We will contact Shutterfly to see what kind of discounted rate we can get for a bulk order. (Without discounts, the books runs well over \$100.) We will see how many are interested in a copy, understanding that you may change your mind if the cost ends up being too high.

WINDOWS AND SIDING

Our congregation signed a contract with Kerns Brothers to replace the windows and siding on the church. The total cost of the project is about \$62,500, and through June our generous offerings have raised \$33,250 for the project. In the May Council meeting the final \$7,192 in the Alice Laho Trust memorial was added to the Windows & Siding Fund to increase total available funds to \$40,442. That leaves us with \$22,058 needed to completely fund the project. Should it be necessary, we have applied for a loan through Lutheran Association for Church Extension (LACE). Council members are currently weighing the merits of possibly using some of our existing savings in lieu of paying the costs associated with borrowing. Your thoughtful consideration for a gift toward this project is appreciated.

HOST FAMILIES NEEDED

MLS is looking for host families for some new international students - four Chinese and two German. The program works similar to inviting a child's friends over. Although simple, the international students appreciate feeling like part of a family and getting into a family setting once or twice a month. Also, it gives them a "family" to spend longer breaks like Christmas and Easter holidays with.

The benefits of hosting are life-long. It is a simple way to serve our Lord with time and talents. The international students get to know what life is like in a Christian, American family. The host families get to know a different culture. The relationships are often long-lasting. Students have returned for visits even after leaving MLS. Host parents also have visited their international "children". To help cover the costs of hosting, host families will receive \$500 per international student.
